

Nicolaus Petri¹⁹⁰, a priest from the diocese of Strängnäs, violently attacked another priest so that blood was shed, and thus incurred excommunication. The injured priest, however, fully recovered and was not disqualified from service. The two priests also made peace. The regent Julianus, bishop of Bertinoro, absolves Nicolaus and grants him dispensation from irregularity, which he contracted through celebrating Mass and the Divine Office while excommunicated.
